With the launch of Landsat 8 in 2013, the Landsat program has created a continuous record of global land cover change spanning more than 40 years. Landsat data is used in science, agriculture, education, business, and government. The Landsat Program is a joint endeavor between NASA and the United States Geological Survey in the Department of the Interior.
